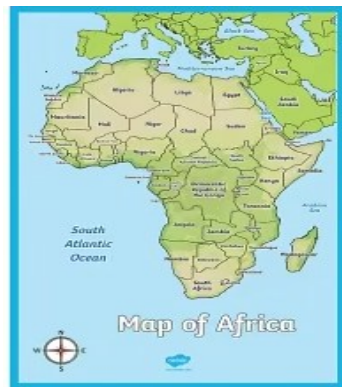


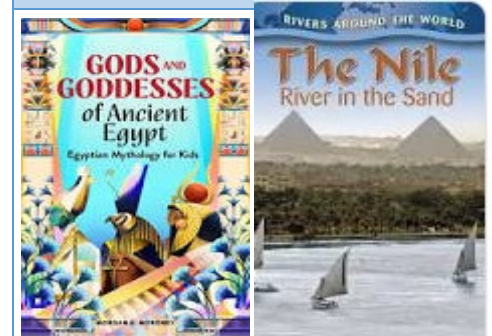
What Makes Egypt Interesting?

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Hieroglyphics	A system of writing that used pictures and symbols (hieroglyphs) instead of letters.
Desert	A large region which gets very little rain each year
Irrigation	A system of canals or channels Egyptians dug to supply water to grow crops over a larger area than the water would reach naturally.
Pharaoh	A ruler of ancient Egypt.
Water cycle	The journey of water from oceans and lakes, to clouds, to rain, to streams, to rivers and back into the ocean again .
Precipitation	When it rains .
Evaporation	When the sun shines, it causes water to warm



5 Interesting Facts
The River Nile - The river starts in the country of Burundi and runs through Ethiopia, Uganda, Sudan and touches a few more before it reaches Egypt, where it flows into the Mediterranean Sea..
The River Nile is approximately 4132 miles long (6650km). That makes it the longest river in the world.
